Turn overripe, blackened bananas into sweet, fluffy American-style pancakes. Serve with syrup and crunchy, toasted pecan nuts as a delicious brunch treat...

- 1. Sieve the flour, baking powder and a generous pinch of salt into a large bowl. In a separate mixing bowl, mash the very ripe bananas with a fork until smooth, then whisk in the eggs, vanilla extract and milk. Make a well in the centre of the dry ingredients, tip in the wet ingredients and swiftly whisk together to create a smooth, silky batter.
- 2. Heat a little knob of butter in a large non-stick pan over a medium heat. Add 2-3 tbsp of the batter to the pan and cook for several minutes, or until small bubbles start appearing on the surface. Flip the pancake over and cook for 1-2 mins on the other side. Repeat with the remaining batter, keeping the pancakes warm in a low oven.
- 3. Stack the pancakes on plates and top with the banana slices, a glug of sticky maple syrup and a handful of pecan nuts, if you like.

Safeguarding

All nursery staff will be attending Safeguarding training in March. It is very important that staff are kept up to date with legislations and practice for ensuring that all children are safe and protected.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION - PLEASE READ

Please can we remind all parents and carers not to leave children in their car unattended in the nursery car park and to keep their speed to a minimum when driving in and out. It is a nursery carpark and not a race track, so please take care when driving so as not to cause an accident.

Can we also remind parents of the importance of completing pre existing accident/ injury forms at nursery. If your child has any form of accident/injury outside of nursery, you must inform us upon your next arrival at nursery. This applies even where there is no visible mark or bruise. Even if you think it is minor, please let us know anyway.

Where a serious accident/ inury has occurred, please ensure a supporting GP or Hospital letter can be seen by the Nursery to confirm if the child is well enough to attend nursery, or what special measures need to be carried out by practitioners.

Room Updates



Babies & Toddlers - The team have been busy settling in lots of new babies and transitioning toddlers and their families. An important part of nursery life is for children to have a sense of belonging, so we encourage this in nursery by displaying family photographs for the children to look at and talk about. Please send your photographs in to teznee@whitehousenurseries.com

Infants - Could parents please spend a few moments to label children's coats and other clothing that might be left in the cloak room, often clothes get mixed up or taken home incorrectly, especially when they are the same item or similar looking. For nursery this can take up hours of our time to find who has the taken the missing clothing home. Please label clothing so it's easier for you to identify.

Preschool - Please can we encourage children to leave toys from home in the car, as we can not be held responsible for any loss or damage at nursery.

Foundation - Please can we encourage children to leave toys from home in the car, as we cannot be held responsible for any loss or damage at nursery. The team are working with the children to develop respect of the environment, by encouraging the children to pick toys up, not stand on or throw toys or pull pictures and boarders from the wall. Also reminding them of the golden rule to choose it, use it and put it away.

Nursery Library

In the reception area we are opening our book lending library for the children in Toddlers, Infants, Preschool and Foundation. These books are colour coded by age as follows;

There will be a clipboard for each unit for you to sign your chosen book out and back in. We do ask that you encourage your child to look after the books and return them in good condition.

Renewing your code is required every 3 months please check the dates carefully that you are given to reconfirm by as these dates can be at any time!!





Books Of The Month

Infants book of the month for February has been 'Brown Bear, Brown Bear'. The childrens learning from this has included learning colours, sorting by colour, mixing colours, introducing 'Beat Baby' to the new children in the unit as well as exploring coloured water and colours in our playdough...

Preschool's book of the month for February has been 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'. The children's learning from this has included looking at life cycles, symmetry, creating patterns, collecting natural materials, tasting foods that the caterpillar likes to eat, creating butterfly homes and exploring the outdoor environment...

Foundation One's book of the month for February has been 'The Gingerbread Man'. The children's learning from this has included baking, investigating, role play, experimenting, shopping for ingredients and problem solving. How else could the ginger bread man get across the river safely?...









Teaching and Learning In Nursery

TALK Derby is a local project about developing adults' skills and knowledge to support our youngest children, and across all age groups.

Every child deserves to have the best opportunities in life.

For this to happen, children need to grow their ability to communicate in their earliest years, throughout childhood and adolescence.

Speech and language are the building blocks for learning.

The project aims to raise awareness of the importance of speech, language and communication development in children and young people, and provides practical support for it.

TALK Derby is funded by the Department for Education until August 2020 as part of the national Opportunity Area programme, and they are supported by Derby City Council, the Derby Opportunity Area and a wide range of other partners.

We at The White House Nursery Borrowash have pledged to make a conscious commitment to spend more time talking and listening to the children in their lives – and to encourage others to do the same. By doing this, we are able to ake advantage of the training available to us through Elklan.

Teznee is in the process of completing a Level 3 Certification, and as part of this will complete a fast track in speech, language and communication for O-3's.

Kelly is in the process of completing a Level 3 Certification, and as part of this will complete a fast track in speech, language and communication for 3-5's.

While Sharna, Luke and Laura are completing Level 1 training in Let's Talk under 5's.

Together this training will help us to plan and provide opportunities for children and families to attend focused stay and play sessions, which are directly linked to developing speech and language. Initially these will be provided for children who may be at risk of delay in these areas.

We look forward to putting what we have learned into practice and seeing the benefits it brings to the quality of our childcare.

In House Staff Training - A Message From Julie

"During this term, we are continuing to roll out two workshops to our practitioners to enhance their knowledge and awareness of supporting creative development and mathematical development within our nurseries. These sessions are part of our ongoing in house Continued Professional Development (CPD) programme.

These sessions ensure we provide age and stage appropriate opportunities and offer an opportunity for reflection and networking for our practitioners across sites. A key element of the workshops focusses on the three characteristics of effective teaching and learning which are:

Playing and exploring - children investigate and experience things, and 'have a go'

Active learning - children concentrate and keep on trying if they encounter difficulties, and enjoy achievements

Creating and thinking critically - children have and develop their own ideas, make links between ideas, and develop strategies for doing things

Cultural Capital

Following recent updates the the EYFS, Cultural Capital will be a new focus for us over the coming weeks and months. The framework explains Cultural Capital as:

"Some children arrive at an early years setting with different experiences from others, in their learning and play. What a setting does, through the EYFS curriculum and interactions with practitioners potentially makes all the difference to children. It is the role of the setting to help the children experience the awe and wonder of the world in which they live, through the seven areas of learning.

In response to this, we have redesigned our 'All About Me' booklet which you will have filled out when your child joined us. This is something that will be reviewed and added to throughout your child's time with us, so we can gain a better understanding of your child's likes and dislikes, and what makes them happy or upset.

We have also included an additional document to this which asks about what 'experiences' your child has has so far. Some examples of these experiences can be found below

Pumpkin or fruit picking Going to the hairdressers/barbers Going to the post office Singing rhymes or songs

Visiting the beach Visiting the Zoo Riding on a bus Going to the supermarket Going swimming Going to the local park Feeding the ducks Walking a dog

Baking Going to a library Playing in the snow Dentist

You will be asked to circle any experiences your child has already had, you may add new ones if they aren't listed. This information will then be used when planning various opportunities for learning at nursery. This will then be reviewed regularly and more experiences can be ticked off!

Welcome to The White House Kids Club!

Our out of school club is aimed at 4 - 14 year olds and runs before and after school, as well as in the school holidays. Kids Club is a great place for children to socialise, have fun, try new things and make friends away from their regular school routine.

Breakfast club runs from 7.30am until 9am and offers many benefits to both children and parents. Children enjoy a healthy breakfast with friends and are offered a choice of foods including cereals, toast, pancakes crumpets, fruit and yoghurts. The children are then dropped off at the local schools ready to start their day.

Breakfast Clubs Run By Us At The Following Schools - Borrow Wood & Redhill Primary School

After School Pick Up From The Following Schools - Borrow Wood, St Werburghs, Springfield, Asterdale, Cherry Tree, Meadow Farm Primary School and West Park Secondary School,

Our on site after school club runs from 3.00pm until 6.00pm. Children are collected from the local schools and brought back to Kids Club for a light tea followed by a variety of activities. After school club is a great opportunity for children to relax and unwind after a full day at school. Children are free to choose from a range of activities suited to their age range, including an X Box, Playstation, Pool Table and state of the art cinema room upstairs!

Redhill After School Club - We also run an After School Club on site at Redhill School. With the same kind of activities on offer as we have at Kids Club, but operating on site at Redhill School hall and using their fantastic facilities both indoors and outdoors. Please enquire at Kids Club for more information.

Holiday Club is available outside of term time during school holidays and inset days. Children have the opportunity to take part in large group games, off site trips and various other activities while improving their social communication skills. 

















Easter Activities
